ECPHRA acknowledges and accepts the submitted Heritage Impact Assessments compiled by Beyond Heritage (May 2024).

There are no objections to the proposed development if the specialists' recommendations are adhered to.

Page 37 on Heritage Impact Assessment Report (Kraljevic, L & Van der Merwe, R) where the following was stipulated:

- Mining and development activities must be confined to the approved development footprint only.
- Monitoring of the Project area by the ECO during pre-construction and construction phases for heritage and palaeontology chance finds, if chance finds are encountered to implement the Chance Find Procedure for the Project.
- Induction Training
- The Monitoring Programme is on page 38 of the HIA.

# In addition, ECPHRA further requires:

- Heritage induction before development resumes and proof thereof to be submitted to ECPHRA.
- Chance Finds Procedure for archaeological, cultural & paleontological heritage must be submitted to ECPHRA by the individual responsible for the implementation thereof. This must be shared with ECPHRA before the mining activities start. Report is expected from the responsible ECO/ESO even if there are no heritage resources discovered on site.
- Bi-monthly reports by specialists, to be submitted to ECPHRA / uploaded on SAHRIS under the case ID.

NOTE: ECPHRA reserves the right to conduct site inspections/monitoring without notification.

Thank you for your email and comments provided.

THE SOUTH AFRICAN NATIONAL ROADS AGENCY LIMITED AND NATIONAL ROADS ACT, 1998 (ACT 7 OF 1998): NATIONAL ROUTE R61 SECTION 9: PROPOSED MINING ON A PORTION OF REMAINING EXTENT OF FARM 89, NGQUZA HILL LOCAL MUNICIPALITY, EASTERN CAPE

Your report received 20 May 2024 on the above matter, refers.

The South African Roads Agency SOC Limited (SANRAL) has the following comments with regards to the above:

No structure shall be erected closer than 30 metres from the national road reserve fence and 500 metres from any point of intersection.

If access is required from the National Road R61, an approval from SANRAL is required, otherwise access can be obtained from the nearest existing access, which SANRAL must be consultant for approval of the upgrading of the existing access, as the proposed mining will have impact on the traffic on the National Road.

The developer will accordingly be required to establish and maintain a pedestrian proof brick/concrete wall along the full extent of the proposed mining to prevent pedestrian access onto the R61.

Only where drainage crosses the boundary wall, a non-solid boundary is accepted. Any future negative impacts in this regard will be considered to be the responsibility of the developer to correct.

SANRAL shall not be held liable should it be found at any future time that noise emanating from the national road, presents a problem in the development adjacent to the national road.

All storm water discharged or diverted from the national road shall be received and disposed of. A drainage plan has to be submitted to this office for consideration.

No advertising shall be directed or displayed to be visible from the national road during the development or construction of this proposed mining. All advertising shall be subject to SANRAL's approval.

A formal application for the proposed development (mining) together with the plans of the proposed mining must be submitted to SANRAL for approval.

Construction of all works may only commence after a written approval has been obtained by SANRAL.

Please note that these are only comments for the application of the Environmental Report, and not an approval of some sort.
