Skemervlei Trust (hereinafter referred to as "the Applicant") intends applying for a mining permit to mine sand from a portion of Portion 2 (Remaining Extent) of Farm 199 in the Clanwilliam magisterial district of the Western Cape Province. The proposed mining footprint will be 1.7 ha and will be developed over an area currently used for agricultural purposes (refer to the satelite view of the footprint area, attached to this document). The position of the permit area was chosen to avoid the disturbance of natural fynbos.

The proposed operation is representative of the small scale mining industry where the mineral (sand) is loaded with a front-end-loader (FEL) directly from the footprint area onto a truck that delivers it to the clients. Little to no stockpiling is required and no washing of sand is needed.

The proposed sand mine will appoint ±3 employees, and due to the small scale of the operation no infrastructure, other than a chemical toilet, has to be established within the mining footprint. The proposed mining area will be reached via an existing farm road that will be upgraded and maintained for the duration of the operational phase. The Applicant confirmed that the width of the road will not increase.

Due to the nature of the sand to be mined (heavy), very little to no water is needed as dust levels are typically low. However, should dust suppression become necessary water will be bought and transported to the farm in a water truck.

The proposed project does not require any electricity connections, and no chemicals will be stored on site. Vehicle/equipment maintenance will be done at an existing off-site workshop (Clanwilliam Town) of the Applicant.

As mentioned above, the sand mining footprint was chosen over an active agricultural area. This area has historically been used for agricultural purposes (cultivation and grazing). In 2012 the landowner developed the first pivot (southern section of the proposed mining footprint), with the second pivot (northern section) following a year later for the purpose of potato farming.

A 4.9 ha sand mine was developed which is approximately 13 m adjacent to the proposed mining area. This sand mine is still active and sand is regularly removed from it, mining permit will expire in 2025.

During the mining permit of an initial mining permit application for 1.5 ha which has expire, Mr Jonathan Kaplan from Agency for Cultural Resource Management (ACRM) prepared an Archaeological Impact Assessment report (2010) for the study area. Mr Kaplan did not identify any significant archaeological resources.




APPENDIX A REGULATION 2(2) MINE PLAN






APPENDIX C SATELLITE VIEW OF THE PROPOSED MINING AREA


